HAZARD STATEMENTS:

Causes serious eye irritation. Flammable liquid and vapor. Harmful if swallowed. May be harmful in contact with skin.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS:

4. First Aid Measures

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW
